Harvest is an opportunity for us to celebrate our gratitude for all the tnings we nave but it also allows us time to think about other people around the world who are less fortunate than us. This year, we will be raising money for the 'Toilet Twinning' charity. It is hard to believe that 1 in 3 people around the world still do not have access to a basic toilet, access to clean water and have a lack of education around hygiene. Toilet Twinning helps communities and families combat this issue, saving many lives across the world.

The actions we take, no matter how small, will help solve the water crisis. The hummingbird is a natural sanitation champion as it instinctively keeps its nest free from bodily waste to protect their young. With this in mind, there is a colouring activity we are sending home on Monday 9th October of a humming bird and we are looking forward to creating a display of the birds in school! Please do encourage your child to colour in and return the humming bird to school by Friday 13th October!

At school, the children will spend time learning about the charity and the importance of safe sanitation. As well as this, we are asking for a donation of £1, to be brought in on the day of your child's harvest breakfast to see if we can 'twin' – for £60 we can twin our toilet and have a certificate to hang up show the photograph of the toilet and GPS coordinates so you can look up the twin's location on Google Maps!



Online and Offline Life

For many of us, we see our online lives as different, but children are growing up with technology and for them there isn't a difference – online life and offline life is just life. Talking to your child about what they're doing online, as well as checking their devices, is a powerful way to help children understand the enjoyment and potential risk and issues they might have. Asking your child to explain what they have learnt at school about online safety and/or to show you their online game, apps they use, etc. will help with this discussion. We have tried to help children to understand the importance of online safety through our school value of 'kindness':

Kindness

When you show kindness you... • pay other people attention • are a good friend to everyone • hear feelings or thoughts behind someone's words • think about what you say before saying it aloud in person and when online • recognise safe and unsafe behaviours and try hard to keep safe both in person and when online


